1 Solve, for $0 \leq x<180^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
\cos (2 x+15)=0.3
$$

Give your answers to one decimal place.

2 Solve, for $0 \leq \theta<180^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
\sin (3 \theta-15)=0.7
$$

Give your answers to two decimal places.
(Total for question 2 is 5 marks)

3 Solve, for $-180 \leq \theta<180^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
\tan (\theta+30)=-2.5
$$

Give your answers to one decimal place.

4 Solve, for $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
5 \cos (x-40)=2
$$

Give your answers to two decimal places.

5 Solve, for $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
\tan ^{2}(x)=3
$$

6 (a) Show that the equation

$$
2 \sin ^{2} x=7 \cos x+5
$$

Can be written in the form

$$
\begin{equation*}
2 \cos ^{2} x+7 \cos x+3=0 \tag{3}
\end{equation*}
$$

(b) Hence solve, for $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
\begin{equation*}
2 \sin ^{2} x=7 \cos x+5 \tag{5}
\end{equation*}
$$

7 (a) Show that the equation

$$
6 \cos ^{2} x=4-\sin x
$$

Can be written in the form

$$
\begin{equation*}
6 \sin ^{2} x-\sin x-2=0 \tag{3}
\end{equation*}
$$

(b) Hence solve, for $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, the equation,

$$
6 \cos ^{2} x=4-\sin x
$$

Give your answers to one decimal place where appropriate.
$8 \quad$ Find all values for $x$ in the interval $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, for which

$$
2 \cos ^{2} x-3 \sin ^{2} x=14 \cos x
$$

Give your answers to one decimal place.

9 (a) Sketch the graph of $y=\sin (x-30)$ for $x$ in the interval $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$
(b) Find all values for $x$ in the interval $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, for which

$$
\begin{equation*}
\sin (x-30)=0.3 \tag{4}
\end{equation*}
$$

Give your answers to one decimal place.

10 Find all values for $x$ in the interval $0 \leq x<360^{\circ}$, for which

$$
3 \tan x=4 \sin x
$$

Give your answers to one decimal place where appropriate.

11 (a) Show that the equation

$$
3 \sin 2 x \tan 2 x=\cos 2 x+2
$$

Can be written in the form

$$
\begin{equation*}
4 \cos ^{2} 2 x+2 \cos 2 x-3=0 \tag{4}
\end{equation*}
$$

(b) Find all values for $x$ in the interval $0 \leq x<180^{\circ}$, for which

$$
3 \sin 2 x \tan 2 x=\cos 2 x+2
$$

Give your answers to two decimal places.
